



Pre-college Camps and Programs – Minors under the age of 13

UWO is committed to being a safe and healthy environment for all. As a public university open to everyone, the University welcomes minors (individuals under 18 years of age) for a variety of programs and activities. All participants in UWO's programs and activities are expected to abide by all University policies, including those regarding sexual misconduct and other codes of conduct. All UWO employees, volunteers, and adult students interacting with minors are expected to follow all UWO policies and the guidelines set forth in the [UWO Minor Protection and Adult Leadership](#) policy.

The University does not tolerate any form of sexual misconduct. To protect minors on campus, all UWO employees are responsible for reporting any disclosures or observances of any form of sexual misconduct including, but not limited to, harassment or sexual abuse to the Title IX Coordinator.

Program participants who are under the age of 18 and/or their parents or guardians can report sexual misconduct by any person (program participant, UWO employee, volunteer, or UWO student) to the UWO Title IX Coordinator and/or law enforcement.

What we will cover with children under 13 years of age:

- We want to go over some important rules for safety while you are here.
- We want you to have fun and be safe with all the other kids and all the adults.
- If you feel uncomfortable or bad about what anyone is doing or saying, we want you to tell us.
- We respect each other's personal space here. That means no touching another person's body without their permission and never touching the parts of someone's body that are covered when you are wearing a swimming suit.
- It means no name calling or put downs of any kind.
- It's okay to tell someone "no" if you don't like what they are saying or doing, even an adult.
- You will not get in trouble for telling us something is wrong or bothering you.
- We will always stay together in groups.
